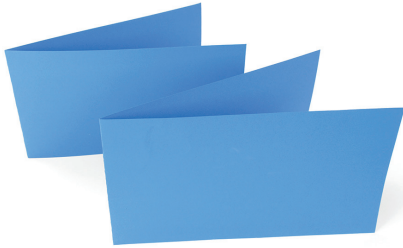

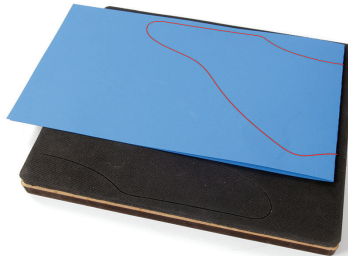

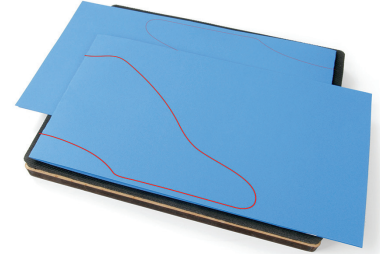

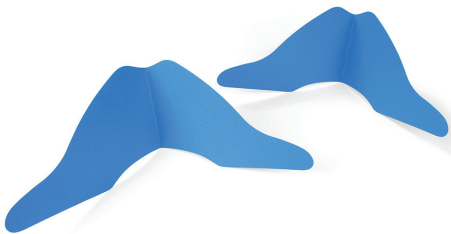

The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.

1. To create the Hat, fold two sheets of construction paper to a minimum size of 6 1/4" x 9" folded (6 1/4" x 18" open) (Figure A).
2. Place one of the folded sheets of paper over one of the Hat shapes. In this example, we covered the shape on the right. Place the fold of the paper to the far right, just inside the top and bottom edges of the cutting blade (Figure B).
3. Place the remaining sheet on top of the Hat shape on the left, with the folded edge to the far left and just inside the top and bottom edges of the blade. Cut according to the instructions provided with your Ellison machine (Figure C & D).
 - You may cut as many as four hats at a time, by placing four folded sheets on each end of the die.
4. Layer two of the shapes on top of each other and staple at both ends. Additional staples can be used to adjust Hat to the size of the child's head (Figure E).
5. Embellish as desired (Figure F).
